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Tactical Pistol Training	3-day course	\$506.00 Min Students 25
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- Three day course designed for those with handgun experience to take them to the next level. Course will cover combat mindset, terminal ballistics, rapid threat analysis and acquisition, shooting on the move, multiple target engagement, and team movement. This course is a hands-on, live fire course with very limited time spent in the classroom. Course is a minimum of 28 hours of instruction and range time.



Tactical Rifle Training	3- day course	\$506.00 Min Students 25
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- Three day course designed for the Operator who wants more out of their rifle. Course covers rapid weapons mounting and transition, proper deployment and combat mindset. Rapid threat analysis and acquisition, shooting on the move, multiple target engagement, and team movement are practiced. This course is a hands-on, live fire course with very limited time spent in the classroom. Course is a minimum of 28 hours of instruction and range time.



Basic SWAT/ CQB	5-day course	\$690.00 Min Students 20
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- This course is built upon U.S. Military Special Operations techniques for room entry; a dynamic, hands on, live-fire course that focuses on dynamic entry and surgical shooting. Designed to introduce the student to the knowledge and skills necessary for this type of entry and to provide them with a training plan for sustainment. Topics covered include zone clearing, diversionary devices, initiative based tactics, width and depth and an introduction to the immediate threat concept. This course covers team communications, team movement and rapid planning. Students will spend a great deal of time executing and discussing the slow and deliberate search methods as well as dynamic entry. The tactical operations center, support element employment and sustainment training are also discussed. Emphasis will be placed on team safety, the ability to select the proper course of action and when to execute. This course consists of a minimum 45 hours of instruction, range and shoot house time.

- Course designed for the government, military, and police departments which may be called upon to deploy to high risk areas. This training emphasizes the role of the PSD element in a high threat environment. Course includes surgical handgun and rifle shooting drills, advanced driving techniques, route/threat analysis, detecting surveillance, advance surveys, drop and arrival, foot movement and interior movement under duress. This course includes live- fire react to contact drills, extensive force on force with role players as well as motorcade operations and the use of the advance. Course is taught by current and former members of PSD's operators in the Iraq and Afghanistan theatres.

**Convoy Operations****5 Days****\$920.00

- Driving with a tactical mindset in a high threat environment requires skill sets not normally used or attained in daily traffic. Since many recent attacks, assassinations or kidnapping attempts have occurred while individuals were traveling, it is essential to learn and practice security procedures that will help deter or prevent such an attack. This portion of the training will examine methods used to secure an element while traveling in a convoy. We will address appropriate convoy actions such as Tactical Motorcade and Convoy Operations Motorcade and Convoy Terms and Procedures, Formation Driving, Tactical Maneuver Movement Techniques, Attack on the Motorcade and Convoy Maneuvers as well as the Confirmation Brief movement, screens and blocks, as well as down vehicle drills.

**Explosive Entry****5 Days****\$1104.00

- This is a challenging multi part course. The first two days will consist of a 16 hour training block that will cover all aspects of explosives theory, handling, storage, and explosives calculations. Phase two of the course will focus on tactical explosive entry and will cover internal pressure calculations, target identification/intelligence, charge selection, charge construction, tactics, techniques and procedures for charge placement and misfire procedures. Course will also discuss alternative breaching techniques such as mechanical and shotgun breaching.

- This is a hands on course built upon the principals of the FBI's Street Survival program. Topics covered include mindset, handgun safety, mechanical breaching, building search techniques, and the ballistic shield. Lecture and practical application is put to the test during our force on force learning laboratory. Students will be faced with escalating force scenarios requiring them to think through a potential problem and take appropriate action. Shoot/ no- shoot decisions while under stress are also highlighted during this course. *Stress Inoculation* is the hallmark of this exciting and challenging course.

**CLS/ BCT3/LTT (Short Course)****3 Days****\$782.00****Min Students 30**

- This course includes our CLS or modified BCT3 course with FTX and Lab exercises under the supervision Front Range Training and Consulting instructors, MD, DVM, 18D and paramedics familiar with battlefield trauma. Essentials of Tactical Combat Casualty Care (TCCC), Combat Life Saver (CLS), and Combat Trauma Life Support are the primary focus of training. Instructors will assess the Trainee's performance and treatments in accordance with guidelines outlined by the CLS course and PHTLS manual, military version, edition. 40-50 hour estimated time per training cycle. Front Range Training and Consulting has developed this unique LTT course and has obtained USDA certification established and verified an IACUC and has DOD approval to perform live tissue training utilizing porcine (*Sus scrofa domestica*) patient simulators.
